


Find the missing angle labelled α (alpha).


1. Right Triangle




2. Isosceles Triangle




3. Equilateral Triangle









6. Scalene Triangle




Work out the missing angles. Remember that a right angle is equal to 90°.


The angles are not drawn to scale, so do not try to measure them!










